Lake Superior Warehousing Co., Inc. comes to UWS

On October 2nd, the T&L Club had the privilege of meeting Jonathan Lamb, General Manager of Lake Superior Warehousing Co., Inc. Almost thirty club members attended Mr. Lamb's presentation. A multitude of questions came from across the room, as students learned about the operations of the Duluth-based business.

Since early 1991, Lake Superior Warehousing has leased and operated warehouses and berths located at the Arthur M. Clure Public Marine Terminal. They handle and store a multitude of products, including talc, pulp, coiled wire, and other manufactured products just to name a few.

Recently, they began to support the wind generated power projects opening up west of Duluth. Geographically, Duluth is a crucial link in the entire transportation network involved in this project. Seven ships are scheduled for next year for the wind projects, which is a sign of future for this port.

The Tar Sands Oil Projects are also utilizing this port facility, bringing in its heat exchangers and other key equipment needed to extract the enormous amount of oil buried deep in our neighboring nation, Canada.

This facility utilizes and supports almost every mode of transportation in some way. Its two gantry cranes have seen a variety of challenging cargo to load and unload in the past years. The warehouse and docks are accessible to ships, rail, and trucks. A unique note is that Lake Superior Warehousing can offer its customers four different rail services, allowing customers more choice and flexibility.

Throughout recent years, this company has developed relations with our T&L Department and regularly provide tours of their facility for Dr. Stewart's Port & Terminal class.

While this flooding is a problem it is minor. To help put the water damage in perspective we should consider the Great Mississippi River flood of 1993. Transportation was severely impacted. Barge traffic on the Missouri and Mississippi Rivers was stopped for nearly 2 months. Bridges were out or not accessible on the Mississippi River from Davenport, Iowa, downstream to St. Louis, Missouri. On the Missouri River, bridges were out from Kansas City, downstream to St. Charles, Missouri. Numerous interstate highways and other roads were closed. Ten commercial airports were flooded. All railroad traffic in the Midwest was halted. That was a flood!

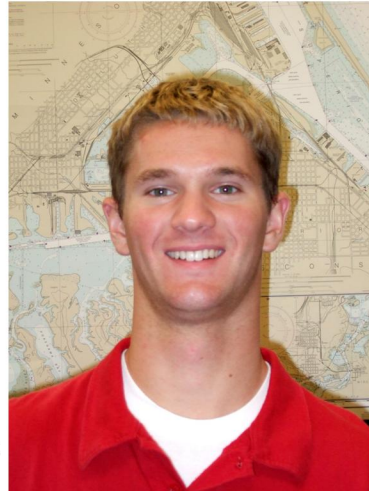
