Physical Education Major K-12 Certification (2004-2006)

The following describes the exact criteria to be met before admission to student teaching will be granted.

1. *Prior to application* you must have earned at least 86 semester credits in university course work.
2. *You must have been unconditionally admitted to the Teacher Education Programs at least one semester prior to admission to student teaching.*
3. You must have attended the University for at least one semester or summer session after being admitted to the Teacher Education Programs prior to student teaching.
4. You must have a minimum combined grade point average (GPA) of 2.75 in your major and minor/s and professional education courses. The combined 2.75 cannot be a result of rounding (i.e. 2.749). The combined GPA in your major and minor/s and professional education courses must also be at least 2.75 at the actual time of the student teaching. No exceptions will be made for students applying to student teaching who lack the necessary 2.75 GPA. Any student may petition any action of the Teacher Education faculty or the Teacher Education Committee, however, with regard to actions either of those bodies may have taken relative to them.
5. You must have successfully completed all required *methods courses*. *For secondary majors, those courses are: TED 338/339 and 300 and the required methods courses in your major and minor. The overall grade average across these courses must be at least 2.75 with no less than a "C-" grade in any of these courses. The GPA of 2.75 cannot be the result of rounding (i.e. 2.749).*
6. *You must complete interviews with the Director of Field Experiences, your cooperating principal(s), and your cooperating teacher(s). Your first interview will be with the Director of Field Experiences. Please make every attempt to create a favorable initial impression with all these individuals through your choice of clothing, grooming and behaviors. These are dress rehearsals for later placement interviews.*
7. A total of four written recommendations on forms provided by the Office of Field Experiences are required. You must have the written positive recommendation of at least two faculty members from your major program, one of which will be your advisor provided he/she is a member of your major program. A positive recommendation from two of the faculty teaching TED 338/339, 350, 465 and 407, if applicable, is also required.
8. You must have removed any and all provisional conditions placed on your admission to the Teacher Education Program at least one semester prior to admission to student teaching.
9. You must take tuberculosis test if the previous test results on file in the University Health Office are more than one year old at the time you start student teaching.
10. You must have obtained the recommendation of the Office of Student Life and Services and complete the same questionnaire you did upon application to the Teacher Education Programs.

Application forms for student teaching can be downloaded from the Teacher Education home page. The form is also going to be placed on the TED web. These forms take several days to complete. You should be aware of the length and complexity of the forms in order to allow enough time for completion prior to the January 31st deadline of the academic year prior to that in which you wish to student teach.

****It is strongly recommended that HHP 110 be completed prior to student's junior year.**
