WITH AN ASSOCIATE IN ARTS (AA) DEGREE

Students who have completed the Associate of Arts (AA) degree or the designated Minnesota transfer (MnTC) curriculum, will have satisfied UW-Superior's general education requirements.

Also, keep in mind, only 72 credits from a two-year campus will apply for credits toward graduation.

STUDENTS TRANSFERRING WITHOUT AN ASSOCIATE IN ARTS (AA) DEGREE

Students who transfer prior to completion of an AA degree or with an AS or AAS degree and who have not completed the designated Minnesota transfer curriculum (MnTC), will need to have their transcripts evaluated on a course by course basis. All college level courses must have a minimum grade of "D" and will be evaluated as to how they meet UW-Superior requirements. The student must then complete courses at UW-Superior which will satisfy the general education requirements. See the transfer guide and the course equivalency guide for assistance.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

A 2.00 or above grade point average is required for admission to UW-Superior. Some majors require a higher GPA for admission to the major. Please consult the UW-Superior undergraduate catalog for specific major requirements, or contact the UW-Superior Transfer Counselor.

The Associate of Arts Degree (AA) or the completed MnTC satisfies the UW-Superior general education requirements for the baccalaureate degree. A minimum of 120 semester credits are required for the baccalaureate degree, with at least 36 semester credits from the 300 – 499 level. A minimum of 30 semester credits must be earned at UW-Superior for the baccalaureate degree to be awarded by UW-Superior. The last 12 undergraduate credits must be earned at UW-Superior.

Criminal Justice majors may include the following courses as part of the AA Curriculum:

- Intro to Criminal Justice
- Criminal Investigation
- Criminal Procedure & Evidence
- Critical Issues and Community Relations
- Statistics
- Intro to Sociology
- Critical Thinking
- Race, Class and Gender
