Transferring to UW-Superior is easy. To help you with the process, just follow this checklist of things to do. Questions? Contact us!

When to apply:

Apply after September 1, 2010, but before August 1, 2011 for Fall 2011 Semester. The **priority application date is December 1, 2010, for Spring Semester, and April 1, 2011, for Fall Semester.** Apply early to be eligible for early class registration and scholarships.

How to apply:

- ❑ **Apply online** at www.uwsuper.edu/admissions. Submit the application along with your \$44 application fee.
- ❑ **Submit official transcripts.** Have your official transcripts sent from any and all college(s)/technical school(s) military/PSEO (CITS)/AP you attended or received credit from to UW-Superior, PO BOX 2000, Belknap & Catlin Ave., Superior, WI 54880. If you do not have the equivalent of an Associate Degree, you must have your high school transcript sent as well.

Available for out-of-state residents other than Minnesota. TAP is a form of financial aid that significantly decreases the cost of out-of-state tuition.

You're accepted! Congratulations - what's next?

- ❑ **Apply for Financial Aid.** After January 1st the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is available online at FAFSA.ed.gov. Complete and submit the financial aid application before March 1st to meet the priority filing date. Applications may be submitted after the priority date, however, funds may be limited. Our FAFSA code is 003925. Get details at www.uwsuper.edu/finaid.
- ❑ **Submit your \$100 Enrollment Deposit.** Pay your \$100 enrollment deposit to the Office of Admissions by May 1st or within 30 days of your date of acceptance, whichever is later. This deposit, which will be applied to your first-term cost of attendance, secures your place in the class and makes you eligible for advising, registration and other services. Students applying for Spring Semester are encouraged to submit the \$100 enrollment deposit as soon as they are admitted.
- ❑ **Apply for Campus Housing if required.** (Look on back for important residency requirements under Housing Requirements.)
- ❑ **Submit placement test scores if required.** (More Placement Test information on back.)
- ❑ **Minnesota Residents.** Minnesota students must file for reduced tuition rates by submitting a reciprocity form to the Minnesota Higher Education Services Office, Reciprocity Program, 1450 Energy Park Drive, Suite 350, St. Paul, MN 55108-5227; (651) 642-0567 or 1-800-657-3866. Apply online at www.getreadyforcollege.org after April 1st, prior to your enrollment.
- ❑ **Register for classes.** REgistration for Fall begins mid-April. Transfer students are encouraged to register as soon as possible after paying their \$100 enrollment deposit. You must meet with your advisor before being able to register.



Transfer details

Transfer Students

Applicants transferring from regionally accredited colleges or universities with a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher will be admitted in good standing. Applicants with a grade point average of less than 2.0 may be admitted on probation if their previous collegiate records meet the requirements of standards for “academic good standing” at UW-Superior. Other documentation may be required for the admissions process, including, but not limited to: letters of recommendation, applicant statement and a personal interview. Applicants who do not have an Associate Degree (AA) or equivalent must have their high school records sent.

Transfer Credits

If you are transferring from:

- A **accredited college, university or community college:** As long as the courses are in a similar curriculum and you received a grade of “D” or higher, the credit should transfer. Some degree programs require at least a “C” or higher in order to be used in transfer. *It’s good practice to keep a copy of your course description, syllabus and catalog from the college/university/community college where the courses were taken.*
- A **technical college:** UW-Superior offers various program-to-program articulation agreements for students who have completed a specific degree program or certification requirement. For specific technical college transferability, contact our Transfer Coordinator.
- A **non-accredited institution:** Credit may be awarded through the Assessment of Prior Learning.

Military Experience

Students who have served one year or more of active duty in the Armed Services may receive credit toward graduation for certain specialized training programs completed while in military service. A copy of your military transcript is required to determine if you are eligible to receive credit. (Examples include the AARTS transcript or DD214.) In awarding credit for such technical or specialized training, we follow the recommendations of the American Council on Education (ACE). A maximum of 32 Military Credits may be transferred into UW-Superior. Students can also receive up to 4 credits for basic training.

Work Experience

Credit may be awarded for related work experience or other work-related training.

Credit Limits

There is no specific limit on the number of credits a student can transfer from a four-year institution. Students transferring from two-year institutions or a combination of two-year institutions, can transfer a maximum of 72 semester credits. In order to earn a bachelor’s degree from UW-Superior, all students must have 30 or more undergraduate credits earned at UW-Superior and the last 12 undergraduate credits must be earned in residence.

Transfer Limitations

Credits and grades are transferred, but transfer grades may not be computed into the resident UW-Superior GPA. Transfer grades and GPA will be used to compute the overall GPA for admittance into a specific department, such as Teacher Education, and for academic honors at commencement.

Placement Testing

UW-Superior requires some transfer students to take the Wisconsin Placement Tests prior to registering for classes. This determines placement into appropriate level mathematics and English. The tests are offered beginning in April and most UW System campuses are test sites. Students admitted to UW-Superior will be sent registration information. Housing Requirements

Freshmen and sophomore students (students who have not earned 56 credits or more as of the first day of Fall semester classes) who are not veterans, married or living with parent(s) or guardian AND who have not reached the age of 20 by the first day of classes of fall semester are required to live on campus.
