is a clinical psychologist in private practice in Westchester County, NY. She is also the founder and president of *Reminiscence*, her business that specializes in personal memoirs and family histories. Teri developed her oral history skills through her doctoral dissertation, an ethnographic study of the experience of being a female police officer in the New York Police Department. She has taught qualitative research as an adjunct lecturer at New York University, and is co-author of *Doing Qualitative Research: Circles within Circles*, an academic text that teaches qualitative skills while emphasizing the interplay between affect and cognition — the emotional and the intellectual — that researchers experience while engaged in the highly interpretative process of ethnography. Since the creation of her personal history business in 1999, she has taught memoir writing workshops in educational settings, hospice, senior centers, and synagogues. She incorporates writing into her clinical work, and has published articles, given workshops and lectured in clinical and academic settings on the therapeutic value of personal history.

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
