Doing Assessment of Student Learning: Working Sessions on Curriculum Mapping and Measurable Performance Criteria for Student Learning Outcomes

Community College, in Highland, Kansas. Prior to July 2009, Verschelden, was an associate professor and tenured member of the faculty at Kansas State University, was also Director of Assessment, and spent a year with the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) as a visiting scholar and Senior Officer for the Office of Assessment Initiatives and Services. HLC is the agency which serves as the accrediting body for colleges and universities in the Midwest.

In addition to her teaching duties at KSU, Verschelden served as a residence hall director, worked with Big Brothers Big Sisters, the Riley County Senior Volunteer Program, and served as Faculty Senate President and Director of Women's Studies. She taught in KSU's social work, American ethnic studies, and women's studies programs. A native of St. Mary's, she attended Marymount College in Salina before earning her bachelor's degree in psychology from KSU. She then received a Master of Social Work degree in social policy and aging from The University of Connecticut and an Ed.D. from Harvard University.
