**MIRIAM ROSALYN DIAMOND, Ph.D.** is a faculty and curriculum developer who has spent the last several years meeting with faculty and students around the country to discuss and learn about the Millennial generation. Her other research includes fostering ethical awareness in higher education, addressing hot topics in the classroom, and the role of mattering in student retention. Miriam's publications include *Chalk Talk: E-Advice from Jonas Chalk, Legendary College Teacher* (New Forums Press, 2004) and *Encountering Faith in the Classroom: Turning Difficult Discussions into Engaged Learning* (Stylus Press, 2008). Miriam holds a Ph.D. in Educational Processes from Northwestern University, an MA in Counseling Psychology from Lesley University and a BSc in Rehabilitation/Counseling from Boston University.
