RECITAL SERIES HIGHLIGHTS PERCUSSIONIST BRETT JONES

Dr. Brett Jones displayed the dazzling versatility of the vibraphone and other percussion instruments when he performed everything from Bach to Klezmer for the University Recital Series Tuesday, March 10, in Webb Recital Hall at the University of Wisconsin-Superior. Jones, assistant professor of music at UW-Superior, features a vibraphone solo in the second public performance of "Star of the Sea," which he arranged based on a Gregorian chant. He pairs off with Dr. Norma Stevlingson on organ, Dr. Erin Aldridge on violin, and Dr. Greg Kehl Moore on saxophone. To close out his recital, Jones brings back Aldridge and Moore along with pianist Dr. Beth Gilbert, bassist Nixon Bustos, and fellow percussionist Gene Koshinski for a rousing Klezmer set.
