

Drug Free Workplace Information

The Drug Free Schools and Communities Act Amendments of 1989, Public Law 101-226, requires that each institution of higher education shall annually distribute to each student and employee information that clearly sets forth university policy regarding the prohibition of illicit drugs and alcohol. UW-Superior subscribes to the goals of the Drug Free Schools and Communities Act and takes this opportunity to alert students and employees to our expectations.

The University of Wisconsin System and University of Wisconsin-Superior prohibit the unlawful possession, use, distribution, manufacture, or dispensing of illicit drugs and alcohol by students and employees on university property or as part of university activities.

The use or possession of alcoholic beverages is prohibited on university premises, except as expressly permitted by the Chief Administrative Officer or under institution regulations, in accordance with s.UWS 18.09(1), Wis. Adm. Code. Without exception, alcohol consumption is governed by Wisconsin statutory age restrictions under s. 125.07(4).

The unlawful use, possession, distribution, manufacture, or dispensing of illicit drugs ("controlled substances" as defined in ch. 161, Wis. Stats.) is prohibited in accordance with s. UWS 18.15, Wis. Adm. Code.

University employees are subject to disciplinary sanctions for violation of these provisions occurring on university property or the work site or during work time, up to and including termination from employment. Disciplinary sanctions are initiated and imposed in accordance with applicable procedural requirements and work rules, faculty and academic staff policies, and collective bargaining agreements. Referral for prosecution under criminal law is also possible. Further, violations of s. 18.06(15) and 18.09, Wis. Adm. Code may result in additional penalties as allowed under Chapter UWS 18.13, Wis. Adm. Code.

Our Primary Goal

The Campus Safety Office is located in the Public Safety Building at 606 Belknap Street. Normal office hours are weekdays 7:30 a.m. to 4:30p.m. Our Security Officers may always be contacted by calling (715)394-8114. **For Police, Fire or Medical Emergencies, CALL 911.**

The Campus Safety Office consists of one Police Officer/Director, one Police Officer, and five Security Officers who provide complete law enforcement and safety services to the campus. Our Police and Security personnel are authorized to enforce all Wisconsin Statutes and Chapter 18 Rules of the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System.

The primary goal of the Campus Safety Department is to serve and protect the University of Wisconsin-Superior students, employees and visitors. The UW-Superior Campus can be considered a community within a community because it consists of 200 acres in the center of the City of Superior. A large part of our responsibility is to provide building security. We conduct walking and vehicle patrols of the campus on a 24-hour basis, with all buildings being randomly patrolled on a continuous basis. We also provide a number of other services to students, employees and visitors.

Services we provide include:

- * Admittance with an after-hours pass into labs and other rooms.
- * Escorts from building to building, or to and from your car.
- * Auto unlocks, if you lock your keys in your vehicle. (\$20.00 service charge if successful.)
- * Booster Pack for Security Officer use on stalled vehicles. (\$20.00 service charge if successful.)
- * Transportation to SMDC-Superior/Mariner Clinic for people with non-critical injuries/illnesses.
