- \* Date, time, and location of incident.
- \* Names, addresses, and telephone numbers of victim (s), witnesses, and suspects, (if they are known.)
- \* Detailed description of suspect(s) clothing and physical descriptions.
- \* Description of any vehicle(s) involved in the incident.

# HATE CRIMES:

Campus Safety is *everybody's* responsibility!

**PLEASE DO YOUR PART!**

## What is a Bias/Hate Crime?

This crime is motivated by bias or hatred of the victim based on the offender's belief or perception of the victim's **race, religion, ethnic or national origin, gender, age, disability or sexual orientation**. A bias crime occurs when the perpetrator engages in criminal behavior or acts against an individual, property, organization or group; based on the offender's perceptions of the above, categories.

Types of crimes committed might range from vandalism of religious buildings or sites to physical attacks against persons. This could include graffiti, annoying or threatening phone calls, harassment, arson, battery or physical attacks.

Campus Safety has many options when investigating and dealing with bias crimes. Below are listed some UWS codes and state statutes that can be utilized in the prosecution of suspects in bias crimes.

### UW Administrative Codes (UWS):

A person may be cited under 18.11(2) for Disorderly Conduct, or 18.06(11)(3) for Improper Use of Telephones. UWS citations are civil forfeitures similar to a municipal ordinance.

**Disorderly Conduct 18.11(2):** No person may engage in violent, indecent, profane, boisterous, unreasonably loud or otherwise disorderly conduct under circumstances in which the conduct tends to cause or provoke a disturbance, in university buildings or on university lands.

**Improper Use of Telephones 18.11(3):** (a) No person may cause the phone of another to repeatedly ring or to make repeated phone calls with the intent to harass any person at the called number. (b) No person may make repeated telephone calls, whether or not conversation ensues, with the intent to harass any person at the called number. (c) No person, with the intent to harass or offend, may telephone another and use any obscene, lewd or profane language or suggest any lewd or lascivious act. (d) No person, with the intent to harass any person at the called number, may make a telephone call, whether or not conversation ensues, without disclosing his or her identity. (e) No person may knowingly permit any telephone under his or her control to be used for any purpose prohibited by this subsection.

### State Misdemeanors:

**947.01 Disorderly Conduct:** Whoever, in a public or private place, engages in violent, abusive, indecent, profane, boisterous, unreasonably loud or otherwise disorderly conduct under circumstances in which the conduct tends to cause or provoke a disturbance is guilty of a Class B misdemeanor.

**947.012 Unlawful Use of Telephone: (1)** Whoever does any of the following is guilty of a Class B misdemeanor:

- With intent to frighten, intimidate, threaten, abuse or harass, makes a telephone call and threatens to inflict injury or physical harm to any person or the property of any person.
- With intent to frighten, intimidate, threaten or abuse, telephones another and uses any obscene, lewd or profane language or suggests any lewd or lascivious act.
- Makes a telephone call, whether or not conversation ensues, without disclosing his or her identity and with intent to abuse or threaten any person at the called number.

**947.013 Harassment: (1m)** Whoever, with intent to harass or intimidate another person, does any of the following is subject to a Class B forfeiture:

- Strikes, shoves, kicks or otherwise subjects the person to physical contact or attempts or threatens to do the same.
- Engages in a course of conduct or repeatedly commits acts which harass or intimidate the person and which serve no legitimate purpose.

**(1r)** Whoever violates sub. (1m) under all of the following circumstances is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor:

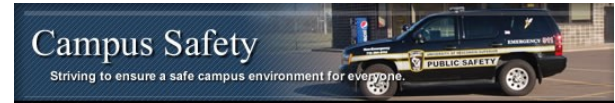
- The act is accompanied by a credible threat that places the victim in reasonable fear of death or great bodily harm.
- The act occurs while the actor is subject to an order or injunction under s. 813.12, 813.122 or 813.125 that prohibits or limits his or her contact with the victim.

**(1t)** Whoever violates sub. (1r) is guilty of a Class I felony if the person has a prior conviction under this subsection or sub. (1r), (1v), or (1x) or s. 940.32 (2), (2e), (2m), or (3) involving the same victim and the present violation occurs within 7 years of the prior conviction.

**939.645 Penalty; crimes committed against certain people or property. (1)(b)** Intentionally selects the person against whom the crime under par. (a) is committed or selects the property that is damaged or otherwise affected by the crime under par. (a) in whole or in part because of the actor's belief or perception regarding the race, religion, color, disability, sexual orientation, national origin or ancestry of that person or the owner or occupant of that property, whether or not the actor's belief or perception was correct.

**In addition, students and/or staff involved in committing bias/hate crimes may be referred to the Dean of Students Office/Human Resources Office and the UW Disciplinary codes outlined in the Wisconsin Administrative Code may be applied as needed.**

## Our Primary Goal



The Campus Safety Office consists of one Police Officer/Director, one Police Officer, and five Security Officers who provide complete law enforcement and safety services to the campus. Our Police and Security personnel are authorized to enforce all Wisconsin Statutes and Chapter 18 Rules of the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System.

The primary goal of Campus Safety is to serve and protect the University of Wisconsin-Superior students, employees and visitors. The UW-Superior Campus can be considered a community within a community because it consists of 200 acres in the center of the City of Superior. A large part of our responsibility is to provide building security. We conduct walking and vehicle patrols of the campus on a 24-hour basis, with all buildings being randomly patrolled on a continuous basis.

It is also the goal of Campus Safety to maintain public trust and further our working relationship with the students, faculty, staff and University Community. To further these goals we are committed to providing a safe and open atmosphere on campus by reducing crime and educating our campus community.
