


Want to participate in the oldest and largest arts festival in the world?



Open to all students, not just Theatre majors or minors. There are two different courses from which to choose :

**An Exceptional Opportunity**

This program is designed for students who cannot spend an entire semester away from their studies, but still wish to experience a study abroad program. Using the last 2 1/2 weeks in August, this program is considered a part of the Fall Term at UW-Superior. The 3 semester credits you earn in this program count as part of your fall term enrollment.

This course is also eligible for consideration in your financial aid package. Plan early with your advisor to maximize your financial aid package.

You will stay at Dalkeith Palace in Dalkeith, Midlothian with other Wisconsin in Scotland students. Using the Edinburgh Festival Fringe as the classroom and laboratory to study theatre, you'll sample a variety of theatrical performances and learn how to critically analyze the performances and write performance reviews.

You'll enjoy free time to experience museums, galleries and other sights, too!

**Edinburgh Festival Fringe**

For over 60 years, Edinburgh has seen an invasion of performers from around the world come together in magic blend of artistic and creative energy. For three weeks, hundreds of performances take place in a variety of spaces located throughout the city. Thousands of people from around the world crowd the Royal Mile watching the street performers. Next to the walls of Edinburgh Castle is the world-famous spectacle of hundreds of pipers and drummers known as the Edinburgh Military Tattoo.
