

What is the purpose of this study away program ?

This program was designed for students who cannot spend an entire semester away from their studies, but still wish to experience a study abroad program. Using the last 2 1/2 weeks in August this program is considered a part of the Fall Term at UW-Superior. That means that the 3 semester credits the student can earn in the program counts as part of their fall term enrollment. It also means that for the students, this course is eligible for consideration in their financial aid package. Early planning will help maximize the financial aid package.

Students in the program stay at Dalkeith Palace in Dalkeith, Midlothian with the other Wisconsin in Scotland students. The courses use the Edinburgh Festival Fringe as the classroom and laboratory to study theatre. Students in this program will sample a variety of theatrical performances as

part of the learning experience. Students will learn how to critically analyze the performances and write performance reviews. Free time is also provided with the ability to experience many of the sights the area has to offer.

What is the Edinburgh Festival Fringe ?

The world's oldest and largest arts festival, the Festival Fringe grew out of the first Edinburgh International Festival after World War II. For over sixty years, one of Europe's most

beautiful cities has seen an invasion of performers from around the world come together in magic blend of artistic and creative energy. For three weeks, literally hundreds of performances take place in a variety of spaces located throughout the city. Thousands of people from around the world attend the performances and crowd the Royal Mile watching the street performers. At the end of the Royal Mile and next to the walls of Edinburgh Castle is the world-famous spectacle of hundred of pipers and drummers in the Edinburgh Military Tattoo.
