

Experience the Arts in Scotland

August 13 – 26, 2012

An Exceptional Opportunity

This program is designed for students who cannot spend an entire semester away from their studies at UW-Superior, but still wish to experience a study abroad program. Using the last 2 1/2 weeks in August, this WIS program is considered a part of the Fall Term at UW-Superior. The 3 semester credits the students earn in this program count as part of their fall term enrollment.

As part of the Fall Term, this course is eligible for consideration in the student's financial aid package. They need to plan early with you and the Financial Aid Office to maximize the financial aid package and how the coursework will fit into their course of study. **The Director of Financial Aid, Donna Dahlvang, will be at the information session on March 28 at 4:30 in HFA Room 2113** to explain financial aid issues and answer questions.

Staff and students stay at the 300-year-old Dalkeith Palace (no elevators in 300-year-old palaces) in Dalkeith, Midlothian with the other Wisconsin in Scotland students. Using public transportation and a lot of walking through the cobbled streets of Edinburgh, the course uses the Festival Fringe as the classroom and laboratory to study theatre. Students will sample a variety of theatrical performances and learn how to critically analyze the performances and write performance reviews. This program is open to all majors and minors. If your students need to satisfy the Fine and Applied Arts general education requirement in History, Criticism and Appreciation, they can take COMM 122 – Theatre Appreciation. If they already have taken an appreciation course, they can take COMM 377 – Special Topics in Theatre for 300 level academic credit. This course also is open to graduate students with a COMM 577- Special Topics in Theatre course listing.
