Drew Strandberg: Winner of the Inbound Logistics & American Society of Transportation and Logistics Supply Chain Scholarship

Over the summer, UW-Superior's very own Drew Strandberg was chosen as the 2013 recipient of the *Inbound Logistics and American Society of Transportation and Logistics* Supply Chain Scholarship. As part of the application process Drew was asked to write a 2000 word essay explaining why he chose logistics and supply chain management as an area of study and how he envisioned his career impacting the industry as well as U.S. and global economies. He was recognized for the award in the June 2013 issue of *Inbound Logistics* where his academic and practical experience was also highlighted. When asked to comment on the scholarship Drew explained that "it is a true honor to be recognized by such well known and reputable logistics and supply chain related organizations. I am proud to be able to represent UW-Superior and its Transportation and Logistics Management Department on such a high level.
