**Introduction and Rationale:**

The University of Wisconsin-Superior maintains an educational partnership with the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities System to provide opportunities for students to enter bachelor's degree completion programs. In the interest of fostering cooperation between our institutions, and to better serve the transfer of students from Fond du Lac Tribal and Community College to the University of Wisconsin-Superior, the faculty and administration of our institutions have established this articulation agreement.

This Agreement specifies the transfer of credit from the FDLTCC Associate Degree named above to the UW-S Bachelor's Degree named above in recognition that the FDLTCC program prepares students for the admission to this Bachelor's degree program. The underlying assumption for this Agreement is that FDLTCC provides a foundation of coursework and the University provides the upper-level courses required within the Bachelor's degree program.

FDLTCC students who successfully complete the Law Enforcement Associate Degree named above and wishing to transfer to the University of Wisconsin-Superior will be awarded the following credits toward a Bachelor of Science Legal Studies (Criminal Justice Concentration) degree.

## Requirements:

FDLTCC general education/breadth courses in communications, social sciences, mathematics and natural science may transfer in to fulfill UW-Superior general education requirements in these areas. All UW-Superior general education requirements not met by transfer credits must be completed.

Other credits from FDLTCC may come in as credits toward graduation, but do not fit in a particular category in relation to the Legal Studies (Criminal Justice Concentration) degree.

Elective courses taken at FDLTCC which are not listed in this agreement will be reviewed by the faculty of the UW-Superior degree program named above on a case by case basis.

57 or 58 total credits are required to complete the bachelor's degree named above.

In order to be awarded a degree from UW-Superior, students are required to earn:

- 120 total credits to complete the bachelor's degree named above
- at least 30 credits at UW-Superior
- at least 36 credits in upper-division courses (300-400 level), and
- their final 12 credits at UW-Superior.

Students are required to complete a final project (Senior Experience) to fulfill graduation requirements for the bachelor's degree named above.

**Conditions:**

The terms of this articulation agreement apply only for the purposes of entry to the Bachelor of Science Degree in Legal Studies (Criminal Justice Concentration) at the University of Wisconsin-Superior. FDLTCC students seeking admission to other degree programs offered at UW-Superior may transfer to the University only those credits recognized under the current UW System-Transfer Guidelines as documented on the Transfer Information System web site at <http://www.uwsa.edu/tis/>.

This agreement is limited to University requirements for completion of a Bachelor's degree only. Students seeking certification for licensure in particular fields must complete any additional requirements for such certification.
