**NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS**

I served as a researcher for the Landmine Monitor (an annual publication) to collect information regarding the landmine situation in Iran from 2003-2008.

Along with Professor Karl Bahm, we offer a new course entitled War and Peace Study Abroad Program. We offered this program for nine different times over the past 12 years.

I offered two academic service learning experiences entitled “From Banning Landmines and Cluster Munition to Killer Robots” and “Refugee for 30 Minutes” for the past 8 years. Each year, we teach members of our University community about different legal, moral, economic and personal aspects of these two topics around the globe.

I served as the country specialist for Morocco and Libya (monitor human rights conditions and promote the members of the public to act on behalf of human rights violations) for Amnesty International-USA. Currently I am the specialist for Bosnia.
