



**AN ARTICULATION AGREEMENT for TRANSFER  
between  
University of Wisconsin-Superior and Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College**

I. Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College, Hayward, Wisconsin, is an independent tribal community college that is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

The University of Wisconsin System has granted permission for the University of Wisconsin-Superior to continue all aspects of our existing relationship.

In the interest of fostering cooperation between our institutions and to better serve the transfer of students from Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College to the University of Wisconsin-Superior, we hereby enter into the following articulation agreement.

II. The following articles delineate the understanding between Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College and the University of Wisconsin-Superior.

1. Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College students who successfully complete an Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts at Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College will have fulfilled all University of Wisconsin-Superior lower division general education requirements (Core Requirements, Knowledge Categories, Diversity and Non-Western Requirements), provided they have completed HTH 107 (Wellness, Health Care and Nutrition) at Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College.
2. This general agreement does not apply to non-college parallel technical programs.
3. Transferring Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College students will be treated as though they had been at the University of Wisconsin-Superior as freshmen and will be given the same priorities and advantages as residential students providing they have met the Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts Degree requirements at Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College.
4. Students who transfer to the University of Wisconsin-Superior are subject to the degree requirements in effect in the student's catalog of entry and to all specified admission processes of individual programs of study.
5. Representatives of Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College and the University of Wisconsin-Superior will explore the development of program to program articulation agreements.
6. Representatives of Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College and the University of Wisconsin-Superior agree to monitor the progress and effectiveness of this agreement.

**This agreement is effective July 1, 2009 and will apply to students who complete an Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts degree at Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College. This agreement may be reviewed at any time at the request of either party; it will be reviewed no later than June 1, 2012.**
