MINNESOTA STATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES* TRANSFER AGREEMENT BETWEEN

Minnesota North Colleges AND University of Wisconsin Superior

*The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities is authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 136F to enter into Agreements and has delegated this authority to colleges and universities.

This Agreement is entered into between Minnesota North Associate Degree Nursing Colleges (MNC), and the University of Wisconsin Superior 801 N 28th ST, SUPERIOR, WI 54880 (hereinafter receiving institution). This Agreement and any amendments and supplements shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Minnesota.

The sending institution has established an **Associate of Science degree in Nursing** (hereinafter sending program), and the receiving institution has established a **Bachelor of Science in Nursing**(hereinafter receiving program), and will facilitate credit transfer and provide a smooth transition from one related program to another. It is mutually agreed:

Admission and Graduation Requirements

- A. The receiving institution's admission and program admission requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.
- B. Students must fulfill the graduation requirements at both institutions.
- C. Students must complete the entire sending program and meet the receiving institution's admission requirements for the agreement to apply, including grade requirements for courses and an overall GPA requirement.

Transfer of Credits

- A. The receiving institution will accept **65 credits** from the sending program. A total of **56 credits** remain to complete the receiving program.
- B. Courses will transfer as described in the attached Program Transfer Table. For system institutions, once the courses are encoded, they will transfer as described in the "*Transferology*" audit.

Implementation and Review

- A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- B. This Transfer Agreement is effective on 06/01/2025 and shall remain in effect until 06/01/2030 or for five years, whichever occurs first, unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
- C. The college and university shall work with students to resolve the transfer of courses should changes to either program occur while the agreement is in effect.
- D. This Transfer Agreement will be reviewed by both parties beginning 01/01/2030 (within six months of the end date).
- E. When a student notifies the receiving institution of their intent to follow this agreement, the receiving institution will encode course waivers and substitutions.

Requirements:

Requirements and Considerations:

Students from MNC must have completed the above-named program with a transfer grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4-point scale for consideration for transfer under the terms of this document and the BSN@HOME UW System Collaborative articulation agreement.

MNC general education /breadth courses in communication, social sciences, mathematics, and natural science may transfer to fulfill UW-Superior's university studies requirements in these areas. All UW-Superior university studies core and knowledge category requirements not met by transfer credits must be completed to meet graduation requirements.

A minimum of 30 nursing credits from the program named above will be transferred in as listed above and counted towards the Nursing degree (BSN) per BSN@HOME UW System Collaborative articulation agreement.

Other credits from MNC may transfer in as credits toward graduation, but may not fit into the Nursing degree.

Elective courses taken at MNC that are not listed in the agreement will be reviewed by UW-Superior faculty in the degree program named above on a case-by-case basis.

- Sixty (60) credits are required to complete the bachelor's degree named above. 120 total credits
- A minimum of 30 credits must be earned at UW-Superior to be awarded any degree from this institution.
- The last 12 credits must be taken at UW-Superior
- At least 36 credits in upper-division courses (300-400)

To be eligible for the bachelor's degree named above, students must maintain a 2.3/4.0 grade point average in upperdivision courses.

Students are required to complete a final internship and senior research project to fulfill graduation requirements for the bachelor's degree named above.

Conditions:

The terms of this articulation agreement apply only for the purposes of entry to the Bachelor of Science Nursing Degree at the University of Wisconsin-Superior. MNC students seeking admission to other degree programs offered at UW-Superior may transfer only those credits recognized under the current transfer guidelines as documented on the TES/Transferology website at tes.collegesource.com.

This agreement is limited to university requirements for completion of a bachelor's degree only. Students seeking certification for licensure in particular fields must complete any additional requirements for such certification.
