#### RESEARCH INTERESTS AND PROJECTS

- Geographic education and the future of geography on local, national, and international levels is my primary area of research and interest. The United States Goals 2000 program was designed to promote geographic literacy K-university and my area of expertise is the implementation and evaluation of these initiatives. I worked with evaluation developer, Michael Patton, Ph.D., author of "Utilization Focused Evaluation" to develop a research strategy to evaluate the National Geographic Education Programs.
- •Academic Service Learning (AS-L) is a high impact practice I have been involved in for many year, serving on the AS-L steering committee, developing AS-L components for both a F2F and an online course and, most recently, the Earth Sciences program received the Engaged Program grant for 2012-2014. A book chapter, co-authored with three departmental colleagues was published in 2014 and an additional AS-L paper was in-progress with Earth Science program colleague, Dr. Riker-Coleman, when she was denied tenure so that paper has not come to fruition.
- •I was a member of the American Evaluation Association and completed two evaluation projects for Cambridge Studios. The first was an evaluation of an eight-part National Geographic graduate-teacher workshop series that was funded by the Annenberg/CPB Foundation and broadcast on PBS. The second project is a multimedia project created for McGraw Hill Publishing and funded by NSF. I continue to do evaluation work for Wiley Publishers, when time allows.
- •I have completed numerous writing projects for John Wiley Publishers. The first project was an AP student manual to accompany Human Geography: Culture, Society and Space by H. DeBlij (ISBN 0-471-27358-9) and the second project was a website I designed, along with 41 active

learning laboratory lessons I wrote that were posted on this site. More recently, focus is on World Regional geography and Earth Science/geology materials with an average of one project completed each summer. Work has evolved into primarily multimedia projects.

- •Certified Teaching Consultant with National Geographic Society and am responsible for all K-12 schools in northwestern Wisconsin. Beyond the required duties of conducting in-service and in-class support, when requested. I have created my own extension to the support network by developing a print and computer library of thousands of geography integrated lesson plans. I authored many of the lessons which are available to pre-service students and practicing teachers. When The National Geographic Society awarded Wisconsin its "endowment" for the support of Geography Education, it was awarded on the UWS campus. Gil Grosvener, President of National Geographic, travelled to Superior to present the \$500,000 endowment to the state largely due to the efforts of our local Senator, Bob Jauch.
- •A two –year \$10,000+ grant from America Online has also enabled me to offer online courses to rural, isolated, socioeconomically impoverished high school students in northwestern Wisconsin to begin taking college courses early. This project was highly publicized by the local media and I developed an evaluation model for the project.
- •Completed two consecutive three-year University of Wisconsin System Technology grants providing workshops and financial assistance to secondary teachers to help them integrate GIS, GPS, and Image Processing into their existing curriculum.
